It is vital that we make an effort to buy the things we always did <u>RIGHT HERE IN CORDOVA BAY</u>. We wouldn't want to lose any of our very good neighbours in the plaza.

And CHECK WITH YOUR NEIGHBOURS when you're planning to do your grocery shopping. Older people may not have a grocery order for \$ 35.00 and may have to use the bus without your help.

Every household in Cordova Bay will be called, and many residents will be asked to help with the phoning: there are upwards of 1400 households in the community.
