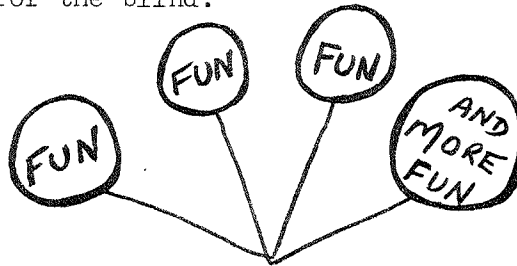

" THE SENIOR CHEF "

Introduction by Bert Dodd, of TV series, "The Senior Chef"

Recently advertised and free to B.C. residents, is the highly recommended Ministry of Health cookbook, "THE SENIOR CHEF", which contains 60 pages of valuable tips on nutrition for senior citizens, and lots of easy, uncomplicated recipes. Sections include a detailed and easy-to-follow explanation of Canada's Food Guide, tips on the buying and storing of foods, keeping an emergency shelf, cooking with simple equipment or top-of-the-stove cooking. Separate sections deal with cheese and milk, fruit and vegetables, vegetable protein, seafood, chicken, and whole-grain cereals, with recipes, and there are special sections on cooking on a shoestring, and leftovers. ARE OUR MUNICIPAL ELECTED OFFICIALS PROPHETS OR PREDATORS?

The Cordova Bay Association now has Social Services representatives participating in meetings of the Community Housing Crisis Task Force. There is a long-term housing crisis which affects us all. Where will our children live? What will we be able to afford to live in twenty years from now? Who dictates what we will live in? Integrated planning for Greater Victoria Capital Regional District which includes preservation of farmland, density of neighbourhoods, mixed income housing spread over all areas, housing for special needs - the elderly, singles, handicapped integrated into neighbourhood areas, more senior government incentives for developers to build lower cost housing and rental accommodation. These are some of the issues being explored.

Irrevocable decisions continue to be made at the municipal level, re-inforcing the trend to more and more high-cost housing for the rich, destruction of the modest single-family home, elimination of rental accommodation, and continued pressure for development of multiple housing units. Fortunately, citizens are becoming more aware and more vocal!
