Soccer Highlights 1983 - 1984

Although Cordova Bay is the smallest sub-district in terms of area and school enrolment, the past season has been a particularly successful one. Notable achievements include the following:

1. Expansion and redevelopment of Lochside Park, a truly community project based on a \$ 46,000 B.C. Lotteries grant; \$ 51,000 municipal investment; and \$ 42,000 cash and labour generated by the community;
2. The largest tournament in the history of the Club, with over 70 teams from Vancouver Island and Vancouver;
3. Unprecedented team successes including:
 - a) Div. 9 Boys - Breakers - unbeaten in league and tournament play;
 - b) Div. 8 Boys - Cosmos - Powell River Tournament champions;
 - c) Div. 6 Girls - Strikers - league winners and B.C. Cup semi-finalists;
 - d) Div. 6 Boys - Ravens - co-winners District Cup;
 - e) Div. 2 Girls - Panthers - winners District Cup;
 - f) Div. 2 Boys - United - winners District Cup; Powell River Tournament champions; unprecedented triple winners at the Lower Island awards banquet, including the trophy for the Best Team in the District Cup; Referee's Trophy as the Most Sportsmanlike Team, and the Goalkeeper's Trophy (Steven Tribe);
 - g) Div. 1 Girls - Cougars - unbeaten league winners and B.C. Cup semi-finalists;
 - h) Div. 1 Boys - Colts - best wishes for their summer tour to Scandinavia, where they will be participating in the Dana (Denmark) Cup and the Norway Cup, involving hundreds of teams from many different countries. Bon Voyage!

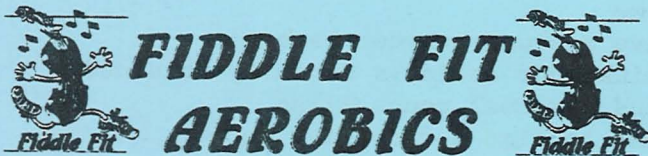

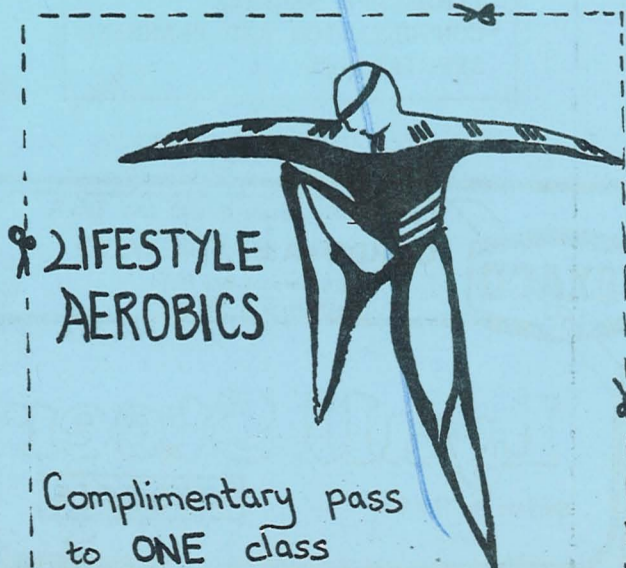
