LOOKING BACK ON DAYS GONE BY.....

From the October 1979 issue of The Cordovan:

HOW DID WALEMA GET ITS NAME?

from Esther CCarmichael) Quick

This gracious knowledgeable lady, now 90 years old, is one of the few remaining people who can still vividly recall Cordova Bay in the 1890's as this was her home. Mr. and Mrs. Rutherford Carmichael settled here on 80 acres in 1886 in the vicinity of today's Fenn and Sutcliffe Roads. This extended from the waterfront right up to where DelMonte Ave. is today. Walema Avenue was named after the Carmichael children - Wally (WAL), Esther (E) and Mary (MA). Cordova Bay children now learn and play where once the family cows and sheep wandered.

Mrs. Quick can recall the summer fun of rowing and swimming in the cold sea, and of watching Mr. Rithet's jockeys race his thoroughbreds over the sand. Mrs. Quick was not able to attend school in Cordova Bay until 1898 when Cordova Bay Road was extended up over the "gravel pit hill" to connect with the East Saanich Road, and an old house near Elk Lake had been converted to a school house. At first only a rough trail connected the Carmichael Property to their nearest and only neighbors, the Touets, who had lived at the south end of the Bay since 1878.

A petition last fall indicated overwhelming support for a single foot path for Del Monte between Claremont and Walema.

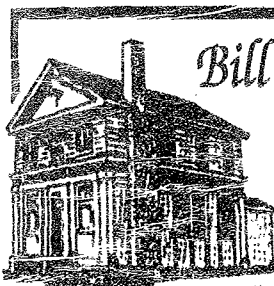
Mayor Leonard, spending considerable time seeking how best to respond, finally presented three innovative options: a chip or crush walkway, a hardsurfaced one, and a third extending to the north end, of Del Monte Avenue. Our committee elected for the least costly and Council unanimously approved it.

At last the residents have the opportunity for a footpath on one side of this heavily traveled street for a modest charge of less than \$9.40 per year for 10 years with the municipality contributing the same amount. Saanich Parks will construct and maintain the path protecting rural ambience.

Please think of our children, the elderly and any who, in the interest of safety, desire a safe place to walk along this busy roadway.

The Saanich municipal hall will send residents in this area correspondence and a ballot. Please endorse this sensible and economic endeavor with your approving vote.

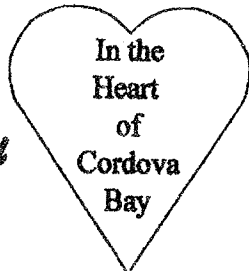

# PLANNING REPORT - SEPTEMBER 1999

There has been little activity for the planning committee over the summer. On September 1st, Bob Krueki, Al Insley, Alison Battuello, and John Noble, of the Executive Committee, met with the Traffic Engineer for the District of Saanich, Colin Doyle, in order to discuss the potential for traffic calming measures in the Sunnymead area. Casey Vandenbrink, an interested resident, also attended. For any action to be taken, such as the installation of speed bumps, there will have to be significant community participation.

At its meeting on September 16th, the Executive Committee of the Association decided to appoint a Traffic Committee, with its initial mandate being the involvement of Sunnymead residents in the consideration of traffic problems in that area and possible solutions. From time to time, the Traffic Committee might consider other areas for attention. Initially the members of this committee are, Bob Krueki,

Chair, Alison Battuello, Al Insley and John Noble.

At its meeting on September 13, Saanich Council considered a proposal for extension to a residence on Wesley Road. Several Wesley Road residents attended the meeting but Council decided to table the matter, pending clarification of issues.

At this meeting, Council gave final approval to the rezoning of the Trio Gravel Pit.

The Streetscape Committee has not met since the last report but it will be meeting on October 1st, and we hope to be able to report progress in the next Cordovan.

Apart from the installation of the Bank of Nova Scotia in a temporary building, there has been no further action on the development of the Plaza.

## NEWS FROM CORDOVA BAY ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

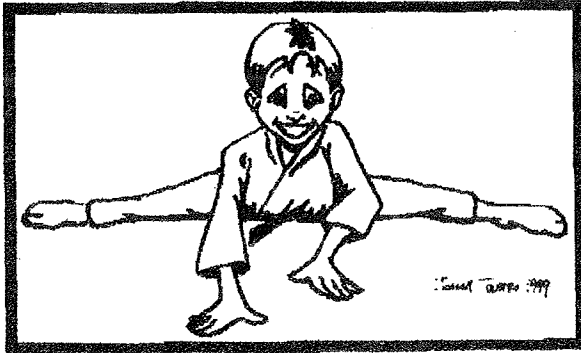
## NEW CONTACTS NEEDED FOR PET'S HOTLINE !!!

## Kids Karate

Have you ever thought that your children might benefit from Martial Arts training? On September 18<sup>th</sup> Cordova Bay saw the opening of new co-ed Youths Karate program at the local Community Centre, t at the end of Sutcliffe Road.

This program is focused around youths age 6 through 12 and will run every Saturday from 1 to 2 P.M. Youths and adults introduced to karate are especially capable of meeting the challenges and demands of today's ever-changing world. Our school focuses on introducing karate to youths in a fun, non-threatening, interactive and respectful manner. Karate is an enjoyable way for the younger generation to set and achieve goals, gaining valuable life skills along the way.

Karate (meaning "empty hand") is a Japanese martial art, which was popularized in the 1920s in Japan. Since that time karate has spread world wide to such a point that millions of people train on a regular basis. Karate practice consists primarily of calisthenics, stretching, Kata (forms) and Kumita (sparing) and self-defense. The benefits are numer-

ous: the development of respect, confidence, self esteem, discipline, physical conditioning and self-defense are just a few.

The instructors are Sensei Kraig Devlin and Gerry Woloshyn, who both have been training for fifteen years with C.A.S.K. and view teaching as a way to "give back" to karate and their community. Another school year has gotten off to a great start. The actual 1998/99 operating deficit is \$77,000, down from the projected deficit of \$255,000. Due to very careful management and close scrutiny of all expenses by district personnel, the Secretary-Treasurer should be credited for providing excellent financial management. The current year financial situation has been greatly improved by our enrolment of students not declining as anticipated.

There was a Celebrating Successes - A Summary Report tabled detailing the work of the Instructional Support Teachers and the teaching staff of the district. The report shows efforts made to support students and improve the quality of educational service provided in our schools. There were 79 different projects, varying from Supporting Early Reading, Solving Problems of Attention and Behaviour, Galaxy Project, and many more. I would be happy to share the full report with anyone interested. The School District is proud of our many talented recent graduates; 65 were provincial scholarship exam winners, which is an excellent result for a district of this size.

Lochside Elementary School's addition is currently under construction and due to be

completed December 1999. The Royal Oak Middle School will have a large mechanical update that will be completed by November 1999. The board will be considering adopting a policy on General Powers and Duties of the Board and Individual Trustees at the next meeting.

The next few meetings of the School Board in public will be Oct. 4th, and Nov. 1<sup>st</sup> at 8:00 p.m. at the School District Offices at 2125 Keating Cross Road. The public is very welcome. As this is the year for elections, I am nearing the end of my three-year term serving on the Board of School Trustees, representing the South Zone. I would like to thank the community for the opportunity to serve in this capacity and I would encourage anyone interested in supporting the education of Saanich students to think about running for trustee in the upcoming election. Serving on the Board is a wonderful opportunity to serve the community and to take part in the education community of Saanich. ## CORDOVA BAY SOCCER CLUB

The 1999/2000 soccer season got underway for the majority of teams on September 18 under a bright blue sky and warm temperatures. We live in one of the few locations in Canada where soccer is played as a fall and winter sport, which means we will start this season in one millennium and finish in the next.

Our registration increased to over 460 players this year in the house league, mini (6 a side), Euro (7 a side) and youth (11 a side) levels. With this number of players, we have been able to form 42 teams. The club also has 4 men's teams and one women's team.

Lochside Park is the home field for the soccer club and it will be very busy on Saturday mornings until the end of October. We have 100 boys and girls in our house league program (5 and 6 years of age) and they have been formed into 10 teams, which play at Lochside Park at 9:00 A.M. on Saturdays. In November, the house league teams move into the community centre on Sutcliffe Avenue and will play their games in dry conditions during the winter.

One of the changes in team formation that

commenced last year, and is continuing this season, is the joint teams' initiative with the Prospect Lake Soccer Club. Because of the small size of our respective clubs, boys at the Under 13 to Under 19 divisions and girls at the Under 14 division have combined to form joint teams. This allows both clubs to provide greater playing opportunities for all skill levels of our players and allows them to play soccer within their middle school and high school boundaries.

Finally, I would like to recognize the Cordova Bay Wildcats girl's team which won a provincial championship last season at the Under 14 level. Although the regular soccer season concluded at the end of March, these girls continued with regular practices to stay in playing condition for the provincial championships, which were held at Maple Ridge in July. The Wildcats played the Surrey Road Runners in the finals and scored the winning goal late in the game to earn a 2-1 victory and the championship. Congratulations to the players, coaches and parents of this team.

### *Healthy Saanich Committee Update*

Many issues were dealt with at the last meeting including the planning that is under way to develop a 'Memory Book' for Saanich with students and seniors collaborating on the project. 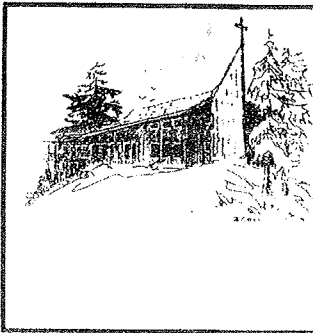

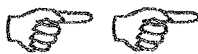

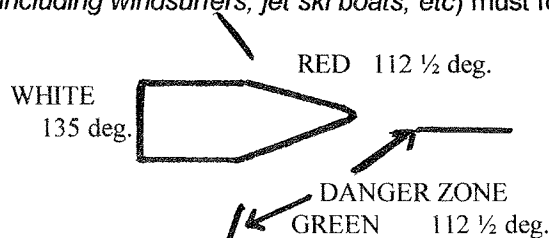

## SAFE BOATING TIPS

### RIGHT OF WAY

Do you ever wonder when you are watching the boats out in the bay, or when you are a passenger on a vessel, who has the right of way. There are no roads, no centerlines, no obvious marks – what is the correct procedure that all vessels (*including windsurfers, jet ski boats, etc*) must follow.



*(computer drawn, not exactly to scale)*

Like a traffic signal, the colour represents whether you have the right of way. A vessel showing her green area or light, is giving you the go ahead. This area is known as a vessel's DANGER ZONE, and she must give way to any vessels approaching in that area. However if you see her red area or light, she is saying 'stop – I have the right of way'.

When two vessels approach each other 'head on', each vessel should alter course to Starboard, and pass on the Port side (Red to Red). When overtaking another boat you may pass on either side, but the vessel you are overtaking has the right of way and you must keep well clear until all danger of collision has passed.

Canoes, kayaks, rowboats and sailboats (under sail alone), have the right of way over a power boat. Sailboats (or power boats) under 20 mtrs in length, must not hamper a large power driven vessel in narrow channels (i.e. Ferries in Active Pass).

SAILBOATS have special rules:

- When two sailboats are on the same tack (wind on the same side), the windward vessel must keep clear of the other.
- A sailing vessel on the port tack (wind on her port side) must keep clear of a sailing vessel on the starboard tack.
- In sailboat races, many other special rules apply.

All rules for right of way apply most of the time – HOWEVER – in fog, poor or limited visibility, NO RIGHT OF WAY EXISTS. All vessels must slow down or be stopped until all danger of collision is passed.

**REMEMBER THE OVERRIDING RULE**, it is the duty of every vessel operator to do everything possible to avoid a collision, regardless of having the right of way.
