THE CORDOVAN IS GOING ELECTRONIC

STARTING later next year, the Cordova Bay Association for Community Affairs (CBA) plans to switch its newsletter *The Cordovan* from print to primarily electronic delivery by e-mail directly to CBA members. New and renewing members are asked to please provide their e-mail address to ease the process. *The Cordovan* will also be posted on the CBA website – www.cbasn.com.

The CBA will provide a limited number of printed copies for personal pick-up at the Super Duper Store (Dollar Store) in Cordova Bay Plaza, Mattick's Farm (on the indoor bench near Adrienne's), the 55 Plus office at Cordova Bay Community Place and Cordova Bay United Church.

The planned change is primarily the result of the limits of volunteerism we have experienced, a factor that affects all volunteer organizations.

The Cordovan began publication in July 1976 as a mimeographed sheet delivered

door to door when the Cordova Bay Association for Community Affairs was founded to represent the community primarily on land use issues. The first CBA effort was to stop a huge subdivision planned on what is now Cordova Bay golf course. The CBA worked tirelessly to have a Local Area Plan for Cordova Bay.

The final *Cordovan* print edition in March, 2010 will be funded by the CBA including once-only free advertising for the merchants and others who have supported *The Cordovan* over the years. We look forward to them joining us in the electronic version in a business directory. Some details remain to be decided such as frequency of the electronic publication with at least two issues a year.

In addition to the electronic *Cordovan*, the CBA, through its website with its many features, will continue to post immediate information under "News" and "Notices." Please check these and other features regularly for up-to-date information about the CBA and Cordova Bay.

Sometimes we are asked: what does the CBA do? Here is a very quick summary:

We examine all proposals for development, rezoning and subdivision to ensure they meet the requirements of the Cordova Bay Local Area Plan. We insist that all applicants for change in land use provide written information to neighbours and schedule one or more neighbourhood meetings.

We attend council meetings to monitor issues, especially involving land use and traffic, and, when required, represent the community viewpoint. We help residents with questions or problems by providing information and assistance.

We maintain the community notice board in Cordova Bay Plaza. We have supported financially such community groups as the Haliburton Community Organic Farm Society and the Cordova Bay 55 Plus Association. With the municipality we co-funded five community redwood benches, three of them at bus stops on Cordova Bay Road.

And we publish *The Cordovan*.

All this work is done by volunteers. By becoming a member of the CBA, you assist this effort, you become part of this community organization, and you gain voice and vote to determine the CBA's direction.

Pollution clean-up begins at Cordova Bay Plaza

WORK CREWS from Beck Drilling and Environmental Services of Calgary began a pollution clean-up project at the Cordova Bay Plaza early this month for approval by the Ministry of the Environment.

The plan, it is understood, will involve burying pipes to vent vapours from underground gasoline pollution. This is similar to the process Shell Canada undertook at the former PayLess Gas site on the other side of Doumac Avenue.

When Saanich council approved the development permit for the new shopping centre in 1999, it withheld issuance of the permit pending lot consolidation and, importantly, confirmation from the Ministry of the Environment that no site remediation was required.

Meanwhile, it's back to BC Supreme Court in Vancouver on April 12, 2010, for a three-week trial involving a lawsuit and counter-suits surrounding the long-standing issue of responsibility for the underground gasoline pollution.

Shell Canada Products Ltd. is suing Your Family Food Mart Ltd. (the corporate name for Cordova Bay Plaza), as well as the previous plaza owner, McMorran's Cordova Bay Ltd. Also sued is Chevron Canada Ltd., which operated a gasoline station on the northeast corner of the plaza property until 1979 when underground storage tanks were removed. The plaza and Chevron are counter-suing Shell.

Shell Canada owns the fenced-off former PayLess Gas station at Cordova Bay Road and Doumac Avenue. It was closed in 1997 and Shell operated an on-site pollution remediation system from 2002 to 2006. The company has said this resulted in a significant reduction in sub-surface hydrocarbons.



SAFE BOATING

Fire on board!

THE RECENT fires in three marinas lead me to some serious thought on possible causes.. All three were on board moored vessels

In order to keep the inside of a boat clear of moisture, mould and possible deterioration of the cabinetry and upholstery it is important to ensure that there is adequate ventilation and a little bit of warmth. What though, could cause a fire in a vessel moored and unattended at a marina? For the protection of your own vessel it is important that you go over the safety aspects of the equipment used to protect your boat over the winter months.

Electrical malfunction such as an incorrectly wired electrical device that has no fuse protection, or is not properly grounded. Result could be an overheated wire causing fire. Some heaters can draw a lot of current. Low voltage convection heaters can be purchased at chandleries, they are more than adequate and do a fantastic job keeping your boat warm and dry.

Propane Tanks – the bottom of the tanks can corrode well before their expiry date (we have seen this upon removal of cylinders from our own boat). Tanks should be in a secure locker with venting, but this is not always the case. Any leakage from tanks, or valves, can find its way into the bilge, where the fumes become a waiting time bomb. Talking about propane, ensure that it is turned off before

leaving your vessel.

A common practice is to leave a **light bulb** on in the engine compartment. This does work well, however the bulbs get very hot and care should be taken to ensure they are not touching anything other than metal.

If you go to the marina to start your engine, don't forget to sniff for **fumes** and use the blower.

A pair of spectacles, a magnifying glass, binoculars, etc.., left at an angle through which the sun's rays shine directly can easily cause paper, lichen (a treasure from beachcombing), or other items to catch fire.


Damp BBQ briquettes, a bag full of oily rags, etc., can cause spontaneous combustion. If you have a BBQ on board, make sure you take the briquettes home – they are very volatile.

Laptops (a boat burnt to the water line this year in Desolation Sound – that was the idenitified cause)

Plain old fashioned, "Human Error"

For those of you who still do not have a Personal Craft Operator Certificate, but have: 1. Completed a boating safety course in Canada prior to April 1, 1999, or 2. Completed a rental-boat safety checklist or who 3. Hold any certificate on the List of Certificates of Competency, Training Certificates and other Equivalencies you must have the certificate with you. As they are usually larger and more cumbersome to carry around, Transport Canada has arranged with providers to issue a PCOC to you upon proof of your competency. Cosmetic industry has some shocking secrets

RECENTLY I had the honor of proofreading a cosmetic chemistry book. What an eye opener! I learned the reasons why all those unpronounceable chemicals appear on the back of a label. It is impossible to create some formulations without adding preservatives or fragrances of some sort. I also learned a few shocking industry secrets.

Mrs. Public is demanding safer, more natural products. In response, the industry has become creative in pandering to the calls for paraben-free, fragrance-free, chemicalfree, all-natural, etc., leaving the consumer with the impression that products are free of these, when they aren't.

Cosmetic labels show ingredients listed in order of quantity in the overall formula, the first being the predominant ingredient, the last being the least. Active ingredients are most susceptible to marketing hype.

The industry knows certain things are in demand and uses compounds containing these in low doses for the sole purpose of label claims, and to keep the price down. (Known as "angel dusting".)

"Natural" does not mean harmless, as many believe. One would assume that one couldn't do without "essential oils", and that their origin from botanicals makes them safe. But lavender oil may cause dermatitis. Grapefruit seed extract can cause brown spots, and palm oil, olive oil or shea butter can cause blackheads and acne.

With today's technology there should be no excuse for poor formulations. However, old-fashioned and questionable formulations continue to be marketed to the skin treatment industry. Price will always be the driving force for formulators, and the old proverb, "you get what you pay for" applies. Consumers beware! Are you wasting your money?
