Cordova Bay Golf Course is Magnetic! Expanding on Environmentally Sound Initiatives

Dean Piller, Superintendent at the Cordova Bay Golf Course since its inception in

1990, says they are now using a new technology used in agriculture to save money on water and other resources. This new technology includes the use of strong magnets installed into the mainline of each irrigation pump station that structures



the irrigation water as it is pumped out onto the Bay and Ridge Golf Courses. These systems, developed by Magnation in California create rain-like water by restructuring the water molecules, improving their solvency and reducing their surface tension allowing delivery of water more uniformly into the soil. These properties allow nutrients to be more accessible to cells, thus developing vigorous crops, greener turf, healthier soils, animals, and people (< http://www.moreplant.com/blog/> http://www.moreplant.com/blog/). Cordova Bay's irrigation staff rely on moisture sensors when determining irrigation run times each day and are noticing improved soil moisture levels resulting in substantial water savings.

Piller says that the summer of 2013 was a trial period for Cordova Bay to test the magnets influence on water savings and plant health. "Magnation claims a savings of up to 20% in water requirements for lawns and crops and crop yield increases of up to 20 percent so we ran a series of research projects using the smaller magnets during hand watering. The results were so impressive that we installed the larger systems this season to treat all of our water used for irrigation." With approximately 1 month remaining in the irrigation season Piller concludes that they are saving close to 20 percent in water and fertilizer requirements while enjoying better overall conditions during what has been a very hot and dry summer. Piller calls it a game changer not only for golf courses but for home owners. A small magnet costs around \$500 to treat your domestic household water that improves your water for domestic and irrigation purposes. 2014 Traffic Report

The vital statistics report for the capital region has just been delivered to every home and the good news is that the Sayward intersection is no longer on the list as one of seven most dangerous intersections in the region. Let's hope we

can have similar success some current problems. The major worry at the moment is the complex traffic problems on the stretch of Haliburton to the highway where pedestrians, cyclists, motorist and buses mix as they move between the ridge and the highway. As a first step we would like to see the traffic signals change at the intersection so that the left turn to Victoria is on longer during peak periods. After that, it is a case of side walks and bike lanes; these come at a cost, which is always bad news. However, in this case there is physical room in the road allowance to make these changes, which is good news.

The other large issue is Sunnymead where the residents are worried about speeding drivers cutting through their neighbourhood. The first step we want to see is a 40 k.p.h. speed limit in the area, which would bring it into line with the surrounding roads. After that, there should be formal stop signs at each junction with the Sunnymead circular drive so that in-coming motorists know they are entering a residential neighbourhood.

The "For Sale" sign has been taken down and replaced with "Sold" on the old Trio site. The land will probably be used as some form of mixed use housing and that is going to present some major traffic issues, so stay tuned.

For all the traffic issues in Cordova Bay, check the website. The next update should be at the end of October.

Changes Coming at Trio Property

The identity of the new owner of the 26-acre Trio property at 773 Cordova Bay Road will be known when the unconditional sale closes on Dec. 15. Colliers International, representing Trio Ready Mix, won't identify the purchaser until then but the Victoria Times Colonist has reported that it is a Vancouver land developer.

The land, a former gravel pit, was listed for sale by the McLaren family last November with an asking price of \$11.5 million, later reduced to \$8.9 million. Its development, across Cordova Bay Road from Sayward Hill, will be significant for Cordova Bay.

There are three zonings from 1999 on the 10.6-hectare site which is inside the Urban Containment Boundary and the Sewer Service Area:

- On the southeast side, 3.45 hectares, where Trio Gravel Mart was located, development of up to 110 housing units in condos and townhouses is contemplated. The zoning is RM-3TR. The condos will be limited to six storeys (18 metres or 59 feet).
- 2. To the north, on 3.96 hectares, the property is zoned M-2 for indoor and outdoor storage facilities. Colliers, however, has said that redevelopment of the property has "the potential to add additional residential units through rezoning the existing M-2 Industrial Zone portion of the site."
- 3. The southwest part of the site, 3.19 hectares, is characterized by Colliers as "unusable green space." It is zoned P-4 which permits a variety of uses including park, community centre, recreational facility, accessory residential, accessory buildings and structures, adult or child day care. Buildings must not be higher than 10 metres (32.8 feet).

Zoning details are set out in the Saanich Zoning Bylaw -- http://www.saanich.ca/living/pdf/zone8200.pdf. Any development at Trio will require a Development Permit Guidelines are set out on the Saanich website - http://saanich.ca/living/community/dpa/index.html. Any proposed change in zoning will require Saanich council approval and a public hearing. A Development Permit, on its own and not accompanied by a rezoning proposal, needs Saanich approval at committee of the whole/council.

Doctor's Corner

If you happen to be one of thousands of individuals who use Ativan, Valium, Xanax, or another benzodiazepine, please take note of a recent study undertaken by researchers from France and Canada. This study found a striking association between benzodiazepine use and the risk of being diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease.

Specifically, people who had taken a benzodiazepine for three to six months increased their risk of developing Alzheimer's by 32%, while taking it for more than six months boosted their risk by 84%.

It is important to point out that this relationship is an *association*, and causation remains unestablished. Nevertheless, the findings suggest a powerful relationship, and given the fact that Alzheimer's disease has no cure, any potential avenue for prevention is compelling.

Meanwhile, there are other important reasons for older individuals to avoid benzodiazepines, including the fact that common side effects, including confusion and clouded thinking, can have disastrous consequences such as falls, fractures and auto accidents.
